During the month of June, I have attended a number of volunteer celebration events connected to Volunteers' Week and it has been a delight to hear the stories of the real difference volunteers are making to people's lives is so many different settings in Northern Ireland.

- The Education Authority held a number of events to recognise their volunteers. One young man told of his
 journey from uncertain young person to confident outdoor education instructor and the key role volunteers
 played in supporting him and being a role model, he said, "I wanted to be like them."
- The volunteers at the Southern Area Hospice told of their experiences in supporting people at the end of their lives and the incredible difference it made to their own lives at the same time.

- The former UTV HQ Havelock House, Ormeau Road, Belfast We have successfully placed Flax Studios in this location and it now operates as studio and exhibition space for over 40 artists. http://www.flaxartstudios.org/
- Castlecourt shopping centre, Belfast. We have placed Golden Thread Gallery in the shopping centre. Golden Thread have grown their audience substantially with the introduction of extension to their gallery that features exhibitions and workshops. https://www.facebook.com/GoldenThreadGallery/
- Bloomfield Shopping centre, Bangor. We have worked with Seacourt Print Works on a pop up gallery. http://www.seacourt-ni.org.uk/
- Bow Street Mall, Lisburn. We are working with Shopmobility to create a motorised wheelchair training facility. We have already trialled this product successfully in Castlecourt and Bloomfield shopping centres.

In return for providing the space they ask the organisation to commit to the space for a minimum of 6 weeks. After the initial 6 week period they usually roll forward on a month to month basis. They also ask the organisation if they are staying beyond 6 weeks to pay for utilities.

Queen's Award for Voluntary Service granted to 22 organisations across Northern Ireland

Buckingham Palace has announced that 22 Northern Ireland based organisations have been granted the prestigious Queen's Award for Voluntary Service.

The Award is the highest form of civic recognition that can be granted to an organisation in recognition of the outstanding work of volunteers.

In welcoming the QAVS Awards this year Department for Communities, Permanent Secretary, Tracy Meharg said,

"This is a wonderful achievement by the 22 recipient organisations across Northern Ireland and, in particular, their volunteers. My Department values the outstanding contribution made by the many thousands of people who invest in their community by volunteering their time, knowledge and skills to support others. It is a tribute to the standard of volunteering here that the Award has been granted to organisations whose volunteers are making such a contribution to local communities and to civic society."

The Northern Ireland representative for the Award said, "This is a wonderful achievement for Northern Ireland organisations as it recognises the dedication, commitment and skills of volunteers who every day of the week invest their time to help others."

Organisations will receive the Award from her Majesty's Lord Lieutenants during Presentations Ceremonies which will be held over the coming weeks.
