Before Christmas they started by tidying up the area, which is an inner courtyard and provided planters and Christmas lights. ### How Can We Recognise People Volunteering Their Time in NI?

The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service is the highest civil Award given to local volunteer groups across the UK to recognise outstanding work done in their own communities. It is the MBE for volunteer groups. Any group doing volunteer work that provides a social, economic or environmental service to the local community can be nominated for the Award. So many volunteer groups rose to the challenge during COVID-19, this is an amazing opportunity to recognise their efforts.

An online information session to promote the Award and explain the nomination process, is being organised by Volunteer Now for potential nominators and interested groups. It will be an opportunity to hear from those involved in promoting the Award and from others who have been through the process.
