Volunteers for this role must be over 18, hold a full driving licence and have access to your own vehicle. Volunteers should live within 10 miles of catchment areas. This role requires an Access NI check.

British Red Cross - Emergency Response Surge Volunteer



Commitment: The service operates on a 24/7 basis. Minimum commitment of 12 months, two 12 hour on call shifts per month. The service has a particular need of applicants with day-time availability

Volunteers for this role must be over 18, hold a full driving licence, have access to your own vehicle and be willing to drive a BRC vehicle. This is a new service and volunteers must live within 30 minutes of Dungannon town centre to enable them to respond to a callout. The nature of the role is likely to involve working unsociable hours. This role requires an Access NI check.
