Millford House - Various Volunteer Opportunities

Milford House (also known as Manor House) is a B1 listed building of national importance and is the former seat of the Mc Crum family, one of Ireland's premier linen manufacturing dynasties. Built between 1864 and 1915, the house is famous for being one of the most technically advanced of its day.



Today Milford House is one of the top ten listed buildings at most serious risk in Northern Ireland. Volunteer opportunities include:

Please note that those who are clinically extremely vulnerable (also known as shielding) are unable to volunteer for the British Red Cross unless in a role they can do from home.

Volunteers for this role must be over 18, hold a full driving licence and have access to your own vehicle. Volunteers should live within 10 miles of catchment areas. This role requires an Access NI check.

Migrant Support Services (Portadown) - Treasurer



Migrant Support Service helps migrants with all the tasks involved in settling into life in Northern Ireland. The Treasurer is a key role in that s/he keeps the finances on track by keeping a record of income and payments. The main task is to take part in board meetings every six weeks and report on the state of the finances. Experience of keeping accounts and presenting financial information is essential. An interest in the business of helping migrants and contribute to board discussions would be good. To do this they need to be good at English and would be a bonus to have a second language.
