# **Learning from Today: Prepared for Tomorrow**

Volunteer Now has published the final Learning from Today: Prepared for Tomorrow research report, which has looked at the volunteering response to the COVID pandemic across the UK. The report focuses on the findings of the research for us here in Northern Ireland, but also includes some wider UK context.

What is clear from the report is the huge impact the pandemic has had on all forms of volunteering. We have seen innovation and new people stepping forward to volunteers, as well as substantial challenges and disruption for many organisations and volunteers.

Volunteer Now will be hosting several information sessions about the research over the next few months. These sessions will give you the opportunity to hear more details about what the research has found and to discuss the next steps for volunteer involvement. # **IiV Quality Assurance Panel Chair**

The Investing in Volunteers (IiV) quality standard is jointly owned by the four members of the UKVF (NCVO, Volunteer Now, Volunteer Scotland and Wales Council for Voluntary Action) to promote the development of good practice in volunteer management.

UKVF partners are seeking to recruit a new independent Chair for the liV Quality Assurance Panel, whose purpose is to ensure that the quality is being maintained across the UK and report on this to the UKVF. The Chair is appointed for three years and this may be renewed for a further term of two years by mutual agreement.

Essential skills and experience include:

- Knowledge of liV, or equivalent quality assurance systems;
- An understanding of volunteering and a commitment to good practice in volunteer management;
- Ability to effectively chair meetings;
- Ability to be objective and fair in taking and/or leading the decision-making process;
- Good communication skills, both verbal and written.

# **Pride of Britain Award Congratulations!**

Congratulations to Hassan Mamoon Al-khawam who was crowned Prince's Trust Young Achiever of the Year 2021 at the recent Pride of Britain Awards!

Hassan and his family fled their home in Syria due to the war and arrived in Northern Ireland in September 2017. Soon after, he enrolled on an ESOL course at the Southern Regional College (having little to no English). Hassan has since devoted his life to helping other vulnerable families and has gone on to co-found NI Hyatt, an organisation that helps other refugees integrate. His inspirational work has earned him the award, which he received at a glittering weekend celebration at London's Grosvenor

#### **Befrienders Cafe**

During the Pandemic, a Befrienders Café was set up to address the issues of those who were most vulnerable, isolated and lonely. The participants, who were identified through membership of Mid and East Antrim and Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Networks, meet every week via Zoom and are able to interact online to chat over a cuppa and enjoy various activities such as cookery, craft and gardening classes.

To build on the interaction and relationships these participants have enjoyed, funding was successfully received through the Northern Health and Social Care Trust's Activity Programme to provide a Christmas Lunch to 50 individuals across both loneliness networks delivered to each of their homes. Everyone also received a Christmas 'goody bag' which included a handwritten Christmas card, Christmas decorations, a Christmas cracker, chocolates, biscuits, toiletries and socks.

Volunteer Now worked in partnership with Larne Community Development Project and the Community Access Support Worker from the Northern Health and Social Care Trust to manage this project, organising the packing and delivery of the 'goody bags' and arranging a local well-known catering company to provide the delicious Christmas lunches. Thank you to the members of the loneliness networks for their support and to Yvonne Carson from the Health and Social Care Trust Wellbeing Team for providing the funding.


We feel that this session is particularly important as safeguarding should be collective in approach and there are immense opportunities to learn from each other.
