There are five award categories:


- Community Relations Council Exceptional Achievement Award,

Police Property Fund Small Grants Scheme

The Police Property Fund Small Grants Scheme opened a third call for funding applications on 1 November 2023.

The Fund, which comprises assets recovered by the PSNI as the result of criminal investigations, is administered by the Board in line with the Police (Property) Regulations NI 1997. The Board has agreed a Grant Funding Policy which will ensure available monies are used to benefit projects which deliver tangible benefits.

The Small Grants Scheme offers project funding in the range of £1,000-£10,000. Applications must demonstrate the following criteria to be eligible for consideration: Engagement with the Police Service of Northern Ireland, Contribute to community safety and/or building confidence in policing and Closely aligned towards a charitable purpose.

Applications close on 23 January 2023 at 12noon.




Publication of the Month: The Cost of Giving Crisis, NCVO
