Our new campaign highlights the benefits of volunteering later in life

Tackling isolation, improving physical and mental health, learning new skills and encouraging social connection are just some of the benefits that volunteering can bring in later life, as highlighted by our new campaign.

Through 'Volunteering Never Gets Old', led by <u>Age Friendly Belfast</u> and <u>Volunteer Now</u>, and funded by the <u>Public Health Agency</u> (PHA), people aged 60 and above are being encouraged to try volunteering to experience the positive impact it can have on individuals, organisations and the wider community.

Throughout Belfast and beyond there are many organisations, community projects and support services that rely on the help of volunteers to exist and thrive. Bank of Ideas - Open Now

Do you have a creative idea for Belfast?

The Bank of Ideas is a **creative fund** where people can be in with the chance to get up to £2,000 to bring their creative idea for the area to life.

Open to neighbours, friends, schools, clubs, young people, one individual with an idea. All creative ideas are welcome - from recycling and baking to skateboarding and gardening!

We're hosting Idea Generating and Support workshops so we can have a chat, help people come up with an idea, develop it and know all the info needed to fill out the Idea form.

The Bank of Ideas is run through a Participatory Budgeting scheme, which means that residents decide how public funds are used in their area.



This happens at a **Voting Day** in City Hall where each person/group has a stall to showcase their creative idea.

Workshops are currently running and the deadline to send in your idea is **Wednesday 14 May 2025**.

Applications now open to join the volunteer support team at The 153rd Open!

Anyone who loves golf or simply wants to soak in the atmosphere of an unforgettable global event can now apply to join the volunteer team supporting The 153rd Open at Royal Portrush Golf Club this July.

Following a hugely successful return to Northern Ireland in 2019, The Open will be back on the County Antrim coast this summer, bringing with it tens of thousands of spectators and a worldwide TV audience.

To facilitate the vast number of visitors to the area throughout the Championship, Volunteer Now is working in collaboration with Tourism Northern Ireland to recruit 150 volunteers to be positioned around the town, meeting and greeting guests, helping with directions, sharing event information and ultimately providing a warm welcome to one and all.
