During Befriending Week in November, Volunteer Now published a report of a survey of organisations which are members of the Befriending Network in Northern Ireland. The findings of the report point to the huge impact befrienders are making in the lives of the people they support. However, it also highlighted the challenges these organisations are facing in recruiting volunteers and in particular the additional struggles they are facing with bureaucracy, particularly Access NI. Older people are finding the online Access NI system a particular challenge and it is evident that all organisations involving volunteers as befrienders need to consider how they support people through this process. 
