# NI Organisations Unite for UN International Volunteer Year

Volunteer Now, the leading voice of volunteering in Northern Ireland, has united a powerful group of local organisations to champion the UN International Year of Volunteers for Sustainable Development (IVY 2026). This global campaign aims to champion and amplify the critical role volunteers play in achieving the UN's 2030 Agenda.

The year-long campaign will focus on the UN's core themes of recognising, measuring, and integrating volunteerism in the development of sustainability strategies.

The group will host a series of quarterly events for organisations, policy makers, and academia in Northern Ireland. These will drive action to build sustainable communities by valuing, strengthening, and securing investment in volunteering.

The IVY 2026 sub-group in Northern Ireland is chaired by Koulla Yiasouma and consists of representatives from British Red Cross, Easilink, NI Cancer Fund for Children, National Museums NI, Housing Rights Association, The Conservation Volunteers (TCV), Multi-Ethnic Sports and Culture NI (MSCNI), Department for the Communities, AbbeyField and Wesley and The King's Trust.



Speaking at the launch of the campaign, Denise Hayward, Chief Executive of Volunteer Now, said: "International Volunteer Year is an incredible opportunity for us to amplify the voice and actions of volunteers in Northern Ireland and to secure long-term commitment from decision-makers to recognise the vital role volunteering plays in our communities.

"By fostering community engagement and collective action, volunteering contributes meaningfully to the places we live. The UN's recognition that volunteering is a powerful

volunteering can truly flourish for the benefit of everyone," Denise Hayward said.

Next year's events will explore the key pillars of the UN resolution, calling on stakeholders to address challenges and commit to action through four dedicated quarters.

The campaign will kick off by gaining a better understanding of volunteering and exploring the latest research on the landscape in Northern Ireland. Subsequent events will then examine the barriers to volunteering and how organisations can overcome these. The second half of the year will focus on neighbourliness and informal volunteering, and how organisations can help champion diversity and tackle underrepresentation in the volunteer network.

Volunteer Now's Youth Team have kicked off our second year with Heroes+ with fresh new faces and exciting sessions ahead for our young people across alternative education centres.

Our Youth Team is currently delivering sessions across three centres: Carrig Leap EOTAS, Redburn AEP and Lagan Valley AEP. Since September, we have been working closely with our young people facilitating teambuilding activities; art sessions, employability workshops, youth-led games and workshops focusing on self-care and mindfulness building a solid foundation for the year ahead.

Young people from Redburn AEP took on the challenge of Prison Island, where their problem-solving skills were trialed and tested. It was a highly enjoyable day although very competitive!!



#### Skills for Life and Work!

Welcoming young people to Disability Action's Inclusive Skills Hub- Skills for Life and Work

Choosing what comes next after school can be exciting, but it can also feel overwhelming. For young people with disabilities, navigating further education, skills training or employment often brings extra challenges. That's where Disability Action comes in. As Northern Irelands largest pan-disability organisation our work spans physical, learning, sensory, hidden and mental health disabilities and at the heart of its mission is a commitment to an inclusive society that adapts to peoples needs and respects their rights.

#### A Hub That Puts Young People First

Based near Belfast City Airport, Disability Action's Inclusive Skills Hub is a new, welcoming space designed for young disabled people. It offers tailored learning opportunities and support to achieve work-related qualifications that support each individual's journey-whether that's moving into further education, an apprenticeship or employment. The DA Skills Hub is more than just a skills learning space. It's a supportive community that young people help shape. Here, they are encouraged to be themselves, explore their interests and take ownership of their development.

From day one, experienced staff will work closely with each individual to build a personal training plan that reflects their goals, strengths and unique needs. Whether a young person wants to build job-readiness skills or is still figuring out what's next, they'll find space, structure and encouragement to progress at their own pace.

#### Learning in the Real World

Through the Skills Hub, young people can:

- Gain recognised qualifications
- Develop practical, social and personal skills
- Learn how to set and achieve realistic goals

# Join the DA Skills for Life and Work Programme

Skills for Life and Work is for you if you are a young person who has left school but need experience of work along with qualifications at Level 1 or Entry Level. If you are aged 16-21 years you can join Skills for Life and Work. If you have a disability, you can join if you are under 22 years of age. If you have an in-care background, you can join if you are under 25 years of age.
